GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. All entries must be made on the official form and received together with entry fees not later than 14th August 2016. No exception can be made to this Rule. Proof of posting is not proof of delivery. No entry fees will be refunded in the event of failure to stage any of the exhibits entered.
2. Exhibitors who have entered, but find they cannot exhibit, are requested to notify to that effect by the 19th August 2016 addressed to: Oakley Farm, Bletchingley Road, Merstham, Surrey RH1 3QN, Tel: 01737 645843.
3. Notification must be made on the entry form whether an exhibitor wishes his/her stand to be cleared by:
(a) Him/herself (b) The Show Organisers.
Only Exhibitors producing their Horticultural Exhibitor's Pass will be admitted to the rear tent between 5.00 p.m. and 5.45 p.m. on Monday 29th August 2016, for the purpose of clearing exhibits.

GENERAL REGULATIONS (continued)

4. All staging will be provided by the Show Organisers. All Exhibitors must stage their own exhibits by 8.30 a.m. Sunday 28th August 2016. The Committee reserve to themselves the right to decline to admit to the Show exhibits arriving after the time specified.
5. Any Class may be cancelled unless there are at least three entries. No Second Prize will be awarded unless there are at least three entries in a Class and two individual exhibitors, with the exception of Class H2. No Third Prize will be awarded unless there are at least 4 entries.
6. Judges may have the power to withhold prizes in any class if they think the exhibits to be unworthy. Their decision is final.
7. Prize money cards (redeemable at the Showground Bank) for individual classes will ONLY be handed out between 3.30pm and 4.30pm on both show days. They must be redeemed at the bank next to the Secretary's bus on either show day. Any prize monies not collected during the show days will be forfeited. Entrants may authorise another person to collect their prize money and must notify a Horticultural Committee member if this is to happen.
8. Only one exhibit may be entered by an exhibitor in each class. No exhibitor shall substitute one entry for another. All exhibits must be cleaned and trimmed before being brought to the show.
9. Arrangement of exhibits must be in accordance with the Rules and Regulations and subject to the approval of the Show Organisers. Nothing can be altered on the exhibits after judging. All vases, plates, etc. will be provided by the Edenbridge & Oxted Show, unless otherwise stated.
10. Only officials appointed by the Show Organisers will be allowed in the marquee whilst the judging is being carried out. All exhibitors and their assistants shall leave the place of exhibition punctually at the time appointed for judging, and any exhibitor or his assistant who remains in the place of exhibition after the time stated for judging shall be liable to have his/her exhibits disqualified.
11. Trade exhibitors may start removing and selling their exhibits from 4.00pm Monday 29th August 2016. Exhibitors will be debarred from receiving prize money if this regulation is infringed. Only persons producing exhibitor tickets will be permitted entrance outside the advertised opening hours.
12. Any exhibitor obtaining or attempting to obtain a prize fraudulently will forfeit any prize money or prize. The prize will be awarded to the competitor next in order of merit.
13. Any protest must be made in writing and handed, together with a deposit of £5.00 (which will be returned in the event of the claim being upheld), to the Secretary of the Show before 12 noon on Sunday 28th August 2016.
14. Each exhibitor will receive one free non-transferable vehicle pass for the purpose of staging exhibits.
15. All exhibitors must conform to the Rules and Regulations and must carry out any instructions given by the Stewards in charge (wearing official badges). The Show Organisers reserve the right to withhold all prize money from any exhibitor breaking any of these Rules.
16. The committee reserve the right to visit any exhibitors' garden/allotment, so as to verify that they have grown the intended exhibit.
17. The Organisers, their officers and servants, will not be responsible for loss or damage of any exhibit or privately owned apparatus and fittings, either at the Show or in transit, nor for loss or damage to any vehicle brought into the Showground during the period of occupation of the Edenbridge and Oxted Agricultural Show.
18. Exhibitors will be wholly responsible for any claims made by any person or persons whom they employ under the Employers' Liability Act or the Workmens Compensation Act, 1925, or any amendment thereof or otherwise and shall indemnify the Show Organisers against all such claims and against all costs and proceedings in respect thereof.
19. The Show Organisers reserve to themselves the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed regulations and conditions, entry forms or sheets, and arbitrarily to settle or determine all or any matters questions or differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show; also to refuse or cancel awards or prizes, medals or reserve numbers or alter any conditions as the Show Organisers may deem expedient. Also to substitute other judges for those announced, or to make additional appointments, and reserve the right to refuse entries.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO 'PLOT TO PLATE' CLASSES

1. Exhibits to be displayed on Sunday 28th August 2016 by 8.30 a.m. Exhibits would be preferably displayed on Sunday 28th August 2016 rather than Saturday 27th August 2016 for health and safety reasons. If exhibitors have to exhibit on Saturday they must keep their exhibit in a sealed container and inform a member of the committee it needs to be taken out on show day.
2. For **NON** National Vegetable Society members only.
3. Preserves/curds/chutneys/pickles must be correctly labelled, dated in full and in **PLAIN** jars. New lids or wax disc with cellophane if appropriate.
4. Baked goods to be baked in size and shape of own choice. All baked goods to be delivered ready displayed on a disposable plate of suitable size. **No fresh cream filling or decoration.**
5. Recipes should be available to enable judges to make a fair appraisal (these are for reference only and need not be put on show).
6. Some items may be on display for a few hours before being tasted. Please do not use fish.
7. Domed covers will be provided for entries once they are on the table.

FLOWER ARRANGING CLASSES

REGULATIONS RELATING TO FLOWER ARRANGING CLASSES

1. An exhibit is to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in the show schedule.
2. Exhibits must be created by the named exhibitor ONLY at the Show venue unless otherwise stated in the Show Schedule.
3. Failure to comply with any specific requirements of a class as stated in the Schedule e.g. the measurements of the components will result in disqualification.
4. Plant material must have its roots or cut stem ends in water or water retaining material unless it will remain turgid for the duration of the show.

Open to all flower arrangers.

All exhibits will be judged according to NAFAS Competition Manual 2nd Edition 2009.

Free standing backgrounds are permitted in Classes H28, H29, H30 and H31 only.

The judge's decision is final.
