REGULATIONS FOR THE SOCIETY'S SHOW

1. The Show to be held at Ardenrun, Lingfield, Surrey on Sunday and Monday, 29th & 30th August, 2010 and thereafter at such place the Council may deem desirable.
 2. All entries must be made on a printed entry form, to be obtained from the Secretary, and must be delivered or sent to her, with the entrance fee on or before the date specified, after which no entry can be made. If known, the name and address of the breeder of each entry should be mentioned, as well as the year in which it was born.
 3. All entry forms must be accurately filled up and signed by the exhibitor or his agent. An Exhibitor omitting to give information asked for on the entry form will be liable to have his entry disqualified. All entries made in a wrong class will be disqualified, and the entry fee is liable to forfeiture. Entry fees will be forfeited in case of Non-Exhibition.
 4. In all classes the Committee reserve to themselves the right of rejection of the entry of any person and also the right of withholding any prize or prizes awarded.
 5. Cows or goats having their teats sealed or their udder faked in any way will be penalised.
 6. All livestock entries must have been the bona fide property of the exhibitor at least three calendar months before the Show day.
 7. Every exhibitor shall prove the correctness of his entry to the satisfaction of the Committee when called upon to do so, or failing to furnish the required proof, may be prohibited from exhibiting, and any prize awarded may be withheld and the award cancelled.
 8. If any animal shall be proved to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease at the time it is sent to the Show, the exhibitor thereof shall indemnify the Society against all or any claims for losses sustained.
 9. No exhibit to be removed from its place in the Showground before 4.00 p.m. without a written permit from the Secretary.
 10. The servants of exhibitors or competitors in charge of animals must be subject to the orders of the Stewards, and must be in attendance during the whole period of the Show.
 11. All horses and cattle receiving a prize, reserve or commended rosette will be required (under penalty of disqualification) to be ready to parade when required.
 12. No one will be allowed in the ring while the Judges are engaged upon their awards, except those who have duties to perform.
 13. Neither the Society nor its officers or servants shall be liable for personal injury or loss of or damage to any property whatsoever happening to or arising out of the presence of any person at the Society's Show and caused by the wrongful act or omission of the Society, its officers or servants, and it is a condition of entry to the Show that any person visiting the Show, including any exhibitors, competitors or their servants shall indemnify the Society, its officers or servants against all liabilities, claims, proceedings, costs and demands arising out of such act or omission.
 14. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Society's Rules and Regulations printed herein, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
 15. Should any questions arise not provided for in the foregoing Rules and Regulations, the same must be referred to the Committee, whose decision shall be final.
 16. All objections must be made in writing to the Secretary within one hour of the termination of the judging of the classes in question on the day of the Show; such objection to be accompanied by a deposit of £1.00, this deposit to be forfeited in the event of the objection proving unfounded and/or frivolous.
 17. Foot & Mouth Disease. Should it become necessary to cancel the Cattle & Sheep Classes owing to Defra Regulations, the whole of the Entrance Fee paid by the Exhibitors of these Classes will be refunded by the Society.
 18. Any Class may be cancelled unless there are at least three entries. No Second Prize will be awarded unless there are at least three entries in a class and two individual exhibitors, and no Third Prize unless there are at least five entries, and no Fourth Prize unless there are at least eight entries, except with the special recommendation of the Judges.
 19. To be eligible to make entries at Members' rates an Exhibitor must have paid the annual subscription for 2009 and pay his subscription for the current year, 2010. New members joining the Society this year must pay their subscription for the current year, and also their subscription for next year, 2011, in advance.
 20. The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.
 21. All riders of horses and ponies must wear a hard hat with safety harness to the current BSI standards correctly fitted. This Rule applies to everyone when mounted and will involve disqualification for those who do not comply.
 22. All horses and donkeys over six months of age must be fully vaccinated against Equine Influenza and Tetanus. Checks will be carried out by the Veterinary Officers on a random basis.
 22. Failure to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations could result in prize money being withheld, possible disqualification and refusal of entries in future years.
- N.B. A Yeoman or Tenant Farmer is a man or woman who derives his/her living solely from the land.

REGULATIONS

- All entries must be made on the official form and received together with entry fees not later than 18th August 2010. No exception can be made to this Rule. Proof of posting is not proof of delivery. No entry fees will be refunded in the event of failure to stage any of the exhibits entered.
- Exhibitors who have entered, but find they cannot exhibit, are requested to notify to that effect by the 25th August 2010 addressed to: Oakley Farm, Bletchingley Road, Merstham, Surrey RH1 3QN
Tel: 01737 645843
- Notification must be made on the entry form whether an exhibitor wishes his stand to be cleared by:
 - Himself
 - The Show Organisers
 Only Exhibitors producing their Horticultural Exhibitor's Pass will be admitted to the rear tent between 5.00 p.m. and 5.45 p.m. on 30th August 2010, for the purpose of clearing exhibits.
- All staging will be provided by the Show Organisers. All Exhibitors (including Trade) must stage their own exhibits by 8.00 a.m. Sunday 29th August 2010. The Committee reserve to themselves the right to decline to admit to the Show exhibits arriving after the time specified.
- Judges may have power to withhold prizes in any class if they think the exhibits to be unworthy. Their decision is final.
- Prize money/ Prize Money cards for individual classes will ONLY be paid out between 3.30 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. on both show days.
- Only one exhibit may be entered by an exhibitor in each class. No exhibitor shall substitute one entry for another. All exhibits must be cleaned and trimmed before being brought to the show.
- Arrangement of exhibits must be in accordance with the Rules and Regulations and subject to the approval of the Show Organisers. Nothing can be altered on the exhibits after judging. All vases, plates, etc. will be provided by the Edenbridge & Oxted Show, unless otherwise stated.

9. Only officials appointed by the Show Organisers will be allowed in the marquee whilst the judging is being carried out. All exhibitors and their assistants shall leave the place of exhibition punctually at the time appointed for judging, and any exhibitor or his assistant who remains in the place of exhibition after the time stated for judging shall be liable to have his exhibits disqualified.

10. Trade exhibitors may start removing and selling their exhibits from 4.00 p.m Monday 30th August 2010. Exhibitors will be debarred from receiving prize money if this regulation is infringed. Only persons producing exhibitor tickets will be permitted entrance outside the advertised opening hours.

11. Any exhibitor obtaining or attempting to obtain a prize fraudulently will forfeit any prize money or prize. The prize will be awarded to the competitor next in order of merit.

12. Any protest must be made in writing and handed, together with a deposit of £5.00 (which will be returned in the event of the claim being upheld), to the Secretary of the Show before 12 noon on Sunday the 29th August 2010.

13. Each exhibitor will receive one free non-transferable vehicle pass for the purpose of staging exhibits.

14. All exhibitors must conform to the Rules and Regulations and must carry out any instructions given by the Stewards in charge (wearing official badges). The Show Organisers reserve the right to withhold all prize money from any exhibitor breaking any of these Rules.

15. The Organisers, their officers and servants, will not be responsible for loss or damage of any exhibit or privately owned apparatus and fittings, either at the Show or in transit, nor for loss or damage to any vehicle brought into the Showground during the period of occupation of the Edenbridge and Oxted Agricultural Show.

16. Exhibitors will be wholly responsible for any claims made by any person or persons whom they employ under the Employers' Liability Act or the Workmens Compensation Act, 1925, or any amendment thereof, or otherwise and shall indemnify the Show Organisers against all such claims and against all costs and proceedings in respect thereof.

17. The Show Organisers reserve to themselves the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed regulations and conditions, entry forms or sheets, and arbitrarily to settle or determine all or any matters questions or differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show; also to refuse or cancel awards or prizes, medals or reserve numbers or alter any conditions as the Show Organisers may deem expedient. Also to substitute other judges for those announced, or to make additional appointments, and reserve the right to refuse entries.

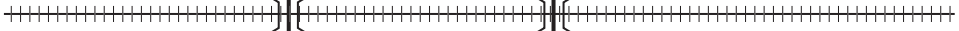
